Every second, more than 200 kilograms of plastic are thrown into the seas and oceans. 70% goes to the ocean floor and 15% stays afloat.



Some data

There are over 70,000 known substances known as pollutants whose discharge into the seas and oceans is one of the main causes of water pollution. This poses a threat to a valuable resource for life on the planet, not only for people but also for thousands of species that live in it. The most polluted sea is the Mediterranean. The coasts of France, Spain and Italy are the most polluted in the world. Next on the list are the Caribbean Sea, the Celtic Sea, and the North Sea. The cause? Marine litter, which constitutes one of the most serious sea pollution problems. Over 60% of the litter that arrives is plastic. Every year, 6.4 million tons of plastic reach the sea.

If we do not take care of our planet and take measures to end water pollution, the seas and oceans can go from being our allies in mitigating the effects of climate change to our enemies. These large bodies of water act as natural sinks of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere.
